MANAGING MEETINGS IN A COVID WORLD

Your committee has been considering how best to address the COVID-19 vaccination status of members as we think about our collective safety when attending U3A meetings. We have a broad membership base, including those who are elderly and immune compromised. As a committee and being responsible for the safety and wellbeing of members, we support the government's position which is that vaccination is essential to ensure community safety.

We therefore strongly encourage all members to have their jabs and be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 before attending U3A events and meetings. If, for whatever reason, you are not vaccinated, then the Committee asks you to explore the option of joining meetings via video conferencing (e.g. ZOOM or Google Meet), options which committee members are currently exploring.

We continue to monitor the ongoing advice of the government around vaccination passports etc. and the ability for organisations like ours to require vaccination before participation in events. We will update you of any U3A policy changes as these may occur.

What we can say at this time is that feedback we have been receiving from the membership generally supports the view that those attending U3A activities should be fully vaccinated. This is in line with Ministry of Health guidelines. The last thing we want is for our organisation to be a centre of a super-spreader event or have anyone become sick with COVID19 after having participated, when vaccination could have prevented it.



Science and Climate Group:


