Warren has put together a powerpoint presentation of photos from the 2023 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration which will be shown at the next meeting on 8 May.



On 12 October 1918, the New Zealand Flying School took possession of the first two Boeing aircraft ever made.

A century later Martin went in search of any remnants of these famous planes.

His journey took him to North Head, Devonport's famous military landmark, which has long been the subject of rumours and urban myths about sealed-up tunnels and hidden rooms.

Martin's presentation will cover the historic aircraft involved and the investigations he has conducted into the presence of sealed tunnels in Maungauika/ North Head

Martin was a pilot for Air NZ for a number of years, flying international jets from 737s right up to 747s. He retired a few years ago and has since

concentrated his efforts on resolving the "North Head Tunnel" riddle.
