#### CHRISTMAS LUNCH, no speakers etc

OUR NOVEMBER SPEAKER was Rob High, from Red Cross – introduced by Pat. The Red Cross is the largest humanitarian movement in the world. We all recognise the emblem – but what is actually behind the well-known symbol? How did this globe-spanning organisation come to be and what does it actually do? Rob told us about November 2023 the humble beginnings of the Red Cross, and what they do internationally – and the programmes and services that are offered here by our own national society, New Zealand Red Cross. Rob High joined NZRC in 2011 (originally as a volunteer). He has held a variety of different roles within the organisation, from coordinating local Community Programmes and liaison to our Volunteer Branches, to managing city-wide street collection appeals in Auckland, Whangarei and locations in Northland. More recently, he coordinated the Red Cross activation at Fieldays 2022 in Hamilton (the first time Red Cross have been invited to attend).

**SOUTH KOREA** Talk given by Iris Durney on Wednesday, 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2023 Iris Durnev South Korea, officially the Republic of Korea (ROK), is a country in East Asia. It constitutes the southern part of the Korean Peninsula and borders North Korea along the Korean Demilitarized Zone. The country's western border is formed by the Yellow Sea, while its eastern border is defined by the Sea of Japan. It has a population of 51.96 million, of which roughly half live in the Seoul Capital Area, the fourth most populous metropolitan area in the world. moved to Ulsan in South Korea to join her husband and daughter who were both teaching English. The country is largely mountainous, with small valleys and narrow coastal plains. Ulsan is a metropolitan city with many high rise buildings. At the eastern end of the T'aebaek Mountains, facing the East Sea (Sea of Japan), on Ulsan Bay, it lies about 45 miles (72 km) north-northeast of Pusan (Busan). Ulsan is the industrial powerhouse of South Korea, forming the heart of the Ulsan Industrial District. It has the world's largest automobile assembly plant, operated by the Hyundai Motor Company; the world's largest shipyard, operated by Hyundai Heavy Industries; and the world's third largest oil refinery, owned by SK Energy. Ulsan has a monsoon-influenced humid subtropical climate with cold but dry winters, and hot, humid summers. Monthly means range from 2.0 °C (35.6 °F) in January to 25.9 °C (78.6 °F) in August. Throughout the ages, there have been various popular religious traditions practiced on the Korean peninsula. The oldest indigenous religion of Korea is the Korean folk religion (a version of Shamanism), which has been passed down from prehistory to the present. Buddhism was introduced to Korea from China during the Three Kingdoms era in the fourth century and the religion pervaded the culture until the Joseon Dynasty when Confucianism was established as the state philosophy. During the Late Joseon Dynasty, in the 19th century, Christianity began to gain a foothold in Korea. While both Christianity and Buddhism would play important roles in the resistance to the Japanese occupation of Korea in the first half of the 20th century, only about 4% of Koreans were members of a religious organization in

Since the <u>division of Korea</u> into two sovereign states in 1945—North Korea and South Korea—religious life in the two countries have diverged, shaped by different political structures. <u>Religion in South Korea</u> has been characterized by a rise of Christianity and a revival of Buddhism, though the majority of South Koreans have <u>no religious affiliation</u> or follow folk religions. <u>Religion in North Korea</u> is characterized by <u>state atheism</u> in which <u>freedom of religion</u> is non-existent. Iris commented that South Koreans are very committed to education with children having very long days at school. Another of her memories were the cartoon figures everywhere even for Police, Fire, Ambulances etc.
