Previous meeting: 2 members met at Pizza Box on Thursday 20 June for a catchup on international events that have caught their attention.

Topics covered included:-

- the US has been active in helping its citizens cope with the cold by providing places where the homeless and low income families can go to keep warm. Now they are faced with the challenge of providing places where these people can keep cool in the face of more frequent heatwaves

She has been an advocate for peace but as a result of her experience, she now says that she has no confidence that the Hamas will agree to it

Four members of the walking group chose to take a wander around the Auranga estate at the end of Bremner Road in Drury. This area is in the process of being developed into a high density housing area by the well known developer, Charles Ma. The retirement village, Karaka Pines, is also situated here and is proving popular amongst retired people. The Auranga estate is situated on the banks of the Pahurehure Inlet and already the area has been laid out with walking paths that give spectacular views of the water which is framed by the planting of flaxes and other native plants. Some of us spent time identifying these using an Ap called PictureThis. Other special features of the area included a jetty which had a map of part of Auckland etched out on the wooden planks, a stone bridge, children's playground with innovative structures and objects that children can play with (and adults too!), cycle lanes, drainage pits along the side of the roads and limited parking for cars! I think all of us were grateful that in the midst of the closely positioned houses, there were green spaces for the residents to relax in and enjoy.

I would recommend a visit to Auranga to anyone who is curious about how these housing subdivisions are being developed and to give thanks for the green spaces that have been incorporated into the overall design.

They are so needed and necessary for the wellbeing of all who choose to live there. PS Auranga means 'wellbeing'! Margaret Gane.
